 <p>If you intend to plant rhubarb outside then do it now. Cover with manure then cover with pots or boxes to encourage growth. Dig over bare patches.</p>					
<p>Sow early carrots, parsnips, broad beans, shallots and peas. Prune outdoor grape vines. Sow leeks, summer cabbage, onions in warm propagator under cover.</p>	<p>Now is the time to sow your seeds including Brussels sprouts, onions, radishes, peas, leeks etc. Early potatoes can be planted mid march. Cover rhubarb. Plant strawberry runners.</p>	<p>Sow cauliflowers, carrots and onions and other salad crops if you have not already done so. Plant out summer cabbages.</p>	<p>Frosts can still occur so be ready to protect new plants especially potatoes. Sow french beans, spinach, runner beans, beetroots, sprouts and cauliflowers. Put up poles for runner beans.</p>	<p>Plant Brussels sprouts for winter picking. Plant outdoor tomatoes now. Other vegetables to be planted now include, marrows, spinach, leeks, cabbages and broccoli.</p>

<p>Your leeks, sprouts, cabbages, broccoli and swedes should be in by now. Remember to water shallow rooted vegetables during dry spells. Remove vegetables that have finished cropping.</p>	<p>Sow lettuce, Brussels sprouts for winter use, sow spring vegetables. Harvest crops that are ready, you may have runner beans, french beans, beetroot, celery, cucumber, lettuce, peas, onion, marrow, courgette, radish, shallots.</p>	<p>Lift main crop carrots and store. You may plant spring cabbages now. Under cover lettuce may be sown.</p>	<p>Harvest marrows, pumpkins and squashes. Clear dead vegetables and dig the ground. Plant spring cabbages and garlic bulbs. Lift carrots. Over wintering broad beans can also be sown and green manures (clover) act as soil improvers.</p>	<p>If you have cloches you could plant lettuce. Cauliflowers can now be harvested and it is also time to make sure Brussels sprouts are safe and secure against autumnal wind. Harvest time for Swiss Chard and radishes.</p>	<p>Harvest parsnips and pick sprouts from the bottom of the plant up. December is a good time to dig over vacant areas and think about crop rotation for the coming year.</p>
